2022 Municipal Election Voter Statistics

Red Lake voter turnout was the **HIGHEST IN ALL OF ONTARIO** at **61.63%**! (1,730 people voted out of 2,807 eligible voters). The average voter turnout in Ontario was 36.30%. Good job Red Lake!

Reminder – Winter Snow Removal

Pursuant to the Snow or Ice By-Law No. 76-2021, all snow removed from driveways and/or parking lots is to remain on the owner's property and is not to be deposited on neighbouring or municipal properties, roadways, sidewalks. This includes pushing snow across roadways. Anyone who contravenes this By-Law may face fines of up to \$400.00.

If your status shows a leak – check all your taps and toilets for running water and make the necessary repairs to avoid additional water usage charges.

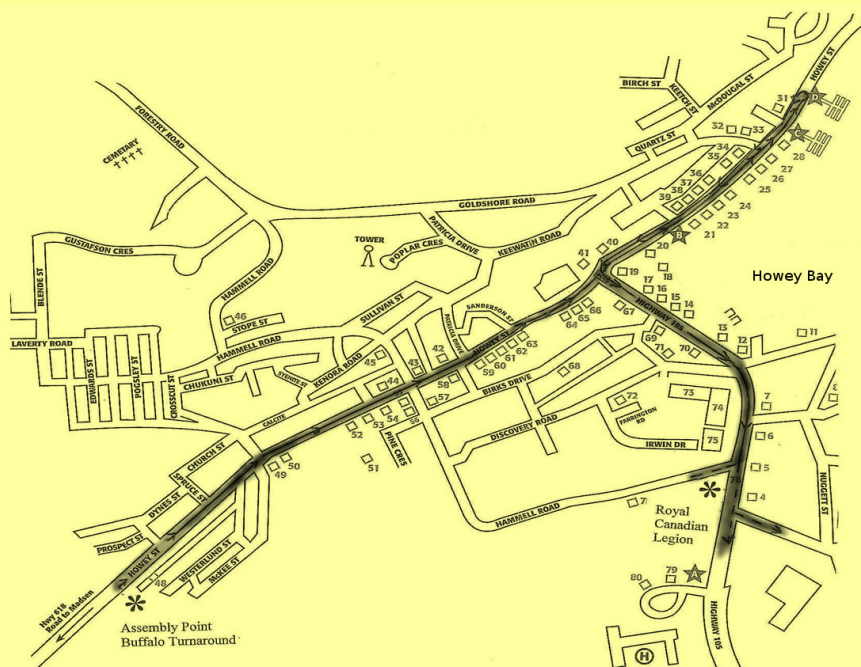
2022 Santa Claus Parade Friday, December 2nd at 6:00 pm
